Further amend the bill in section 1 in paragraph C in subparagraph (6) in the last line (page 2, line 5 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "section" and inserting in its place the following: 'subparagraph'

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Further amend the bill by striking out all of section 2.

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

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FISCAL NOTE

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Allowing the Department of Labor to recover overpayment of unemployment benefits through wage garnishment will increase funds that are reimbursed to the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund. The amounts cannot be determined at this time.

This bill may increase the number of civil suits filed in the court system. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional filing fees may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

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SUMMARY

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This amendment is a minority report of the committee. amendment clarifies that the withholding order may be issued only overpayment results from nondisclosure The amendment lowers from \$500 to \$100 the misrepresentation. minimum amount of debt with respect to which a withholding order may be issued. It also clarifies the process by which an individual may seek a review of a notice of debt accrued, and it places a floor of 40 times the federal minimum wage under which withholding may not take the individual's weekly disposable income. It clarifies the intent of the original bill to limit an employee's right of civil action against the employer to a circumstance in which the employer has discharged the employee because of a withholding order. Finally, it removes provision of the original bill that allows lottery winnings to be offset to recover unemployment benefit payments owed to the Department of Labor. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to

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the bill.

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
