This bill establishes the Search and Rescue Fund to fund search and rescue activities of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources. The revenue generated from a \$1 surcharge on licenses sold by the Department of Marine Resources and on all-terrain vehicle and snowmobile registrations must be deposited in the fund. The fund managed and overseen by a committee consisting representatives of the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources and public members. The bill allows the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife and the Department of Marine Resources to recover the cost of providing search and rescue services from a person who intentionally gives false or misleading information that causes an unnecessary search and rescue effort or prolongs an ongoing search and rescue effort.
