Sec. 11. Report. The Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over health and human services matters by January 1, 1997 and by January 1, 1998 on the operation of quality improvement councils established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-B, section 3607 and local service networks as established in Title section 3608 and shall include recommendations improving the operations and any legislation necessary accomplish those purposes. The 1998 report must include any recommendations or legislation necessary to accomplish plans for delivery of services to children and adults who have a major mental illness required by the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 34-B, section 3607, subsection 5. In preparing these recommendations or legislation, the commissioner shall examine the laws of Missouri and other states that provide local mental health services to children and adults who have a major mental illness.

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#### **SUMMARY**

Under current law, quality improvement councils established in regions of the State and operating under the authority of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services are developing plans to deliver services through local mental health systems to children and adults under the authority of the department. This bill defines "major mental illness" and extends the requirement for delivering local mental health services to persons who may not be under the authority of the department but who have a major mental illness. The bill requires the Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to review other states' laws regarding the provision of such services and to report to the Legislature on implementing the extension of local mental health services to persons not under the department's authority.
