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## STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES **118TH LEGISLATURE** FIRST SPECIAL SESSION

18 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT to H.P. 1086, L.D. 1529, "Resolve, to Determine How to Increase the Number of Students Consuming 20 School Meals"

Amend the resolve by striking out everything after the title 24 and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. Review of school food programs. Resolved: 26 That the Department of Education, in conjunction with the Center for Research and Evaluation at the University of Maine, the Maine 28 School Food Service Association, the Maine Dietetic Association 30 and the Maine School Management Association shall review free and reduced-price school meal programs. The purpose of this review 32 is to determine the overall effectiveness of the programs in satisfying the nutritional needs of students by providing 34 nutritionally balanced and appealing meals. The Center for Research and Evaluation shall analyze the percentage of eligible students and the level of consumption of the food provided 36 through the school meal programs. In analyzing school food 38 consumption, the Center for Research and Evaluation may survey or interview students, parents and food service personnel or conduct 40 on-site observations and inspections; and be it further

Sec. 2. Development of plan to address problems. Resolved: That if, as a result of this review, the Department of Education or the Center for Research and Evaluation identifies shortcomings or areas of concern in the rate of participation or actual level of food consumed through school meal programs, the Department of Education or the Center for Research and Evaluation shall develop a plan to address the concerns. The plan must include a means of 48 offering a program of technical assistance designed to replicate

sound practices identified in specific schools, informing 2 identified schools of the free peer review assistance provided through the Maine School Food Service Association, and the merits of encouraging a statewide "Take Your Relative to Lunch Day" initiative, on "Children's Day" and other days throughout the In addition, methods of providing identified 6 school year. schools with model menus may be considered. The plan must also include a schedule for implementation and be based upon existing 8 state, local and volunteer resources; and be it further

Sec. 3. Report. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall report to the Legislature by January 15, 1998. The report must include the findings, recommendations and methods of implementation."

Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

**'FISCAL NOTE** 

22 The additional costs associated with conducting a review of school lunch programs and reporting on the results of that review can be absorbed by the Department of Education utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

### **SUMMARY**

This resolve directs the Department of Education and the 32 Center for Research and Evaluation at the University of Maine to study methods to improve school meal programs and report to the Legislature by January 15, 1998. The percentage of eligible 34 students for the free and reduced-price school meal programs and 3.6 the actual rate of consumption and the relationship between food appeal and consumption will be analyzed. If problem areas are 38 identified as a result of the study, the department is required to work with other interested parties to develop a plan to 40 improve those areas within existing resources.

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
