This amendment, which is the majority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Natural Resources, requires that the report on the progress of the mapping of significant wildlife habitats be submitted to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters as well as the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters and that the report be submitted January 1, 1998 and on or before January 1st of every odd-numbered year thereafter. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
