Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 4 MRSA §955-B, as amended by PL 1993, c. 485, §1, is further amended to read:

6 §955-B. Maintenance of records

8 The-Secretary-of-State-shall-recommend-that-every Every notary public <u>shall</u> keep and maintain records of all notarial 10 acts performed. The notary shall safeguard and retain exclusive custody of these records. The notary may not surrender the 12 records to another notary or to an employer. The records may be inspected in the notary's presence by any individual whose 14 identity is personally known to the notary or is proven on the basis of satisfactory evidence and who specifies the notarial act 16 to be examined.

The requirements requirement to keep a seal under section 951 and--records-under--section-955 B--are is not in force for notaries who are commissioned before November 1, 1991. The requirement to keep records under section 955-B is not in force for notaries who are commissioned before November 1, 1997. If the commissions are renewed, the requirements of those sections take effect upon renewal.

SUMMARY

34 This bill requires notaries to maintain records of all notarial acts performed. The bill also adds a grandfather clause for notaries commissioned before November 1, 1997.
