Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4708, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 248, is amended to read:

§4708. Grades final

When grades are given for any course of instruction offered by a school, the grade awarded to a student is the grade determined by the teacher of the course and the determination of a student's grade by that teacher, in the absence of clerical or mechanical mistake, fraud, bad faith or incompetence, is final only if the teacher is able to establish, if requested, in a hearing, the basis for the student's grade and that the teacher neither took any action nor failed to take any action that contributed to a reduction in the grade.

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SUMMARY

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This bill amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 4708 concerning the finality of a student's grade by requiring the teacher, upon request, to establish in a hearing the basis for the student's grade and that the teacher neither took any action nor failed to take any action that contributed to a reduction in the grade.
