Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study the Restructuring of the University of Maine System.

(EMERGENCY)

Presented by Representative STEVENS of Orono. Cosponsored by Senator CATHCART of Penobscot and Representative DUNLAP of Old Town. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6 Whereas, this resolve establishes a commission to study the 6 restructuring of the University of Maine System; and

8 Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a 10 report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Restructuring of the University of Maine System, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

24 Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 15 members appointed jointly by the 26 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House:

 Twelve representatives from the University of Maine System, 3 of whom represent the students, 3 of whom represent the faculty, 3 of whom represent staff employees and 3 of whom represent the alumni; and

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2. Three members of the public; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments
must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative
Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days after appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. The commission
shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall:

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2. Study the feasibility of eliminating the Office of the

1. Study the feasibility of restructuring the University of

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Chancellor of the University of Maine System and redistributing the money allocated to that office to the institutions in the system; and

Explore alternative ways of creating funding for the
 University of Maine System.

8 In conducting the study the commission shall review the November 12, 1996 report of the University of Maine Legislative 10 Liaison Committee, <u>A Proposal to Restructure the University of</u> <u>Maine System</u>; and be it further

Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 6. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission serve without compensation; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature no later than January 1, 1998. If the commission requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Restructuring of the University of Maine System.

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
