COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 499, L.D. 1561

Whereas, it is vitally important that an organized effort be put in place to assist municipal and regional agencies to begin to plan for the impact of federal devolution decisions; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Governor's Municipal Advisory Council to examine the 12 impact of federal devolution decisions on municipalities. Resolved: That the Governor's Municipal Advisory Council, established pursuant to Executive Order No. 14 FY 1986-87, and referred to in this 14 resolve as "the council" as part of its deliberations shall examine the direct and indirect impacts of the delegation of 16 federal responsibilities and reduction in federal funding levels 18 on municipalities and regional and local agencies and programs. The Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Bureau 20 of the Budget and the Executive Department, State Planning Office shall assist the council in its examination; and be it further

Sec. 2. Report. Resolved: That the council shall report to the Legislature by February 1, 1998 on its findings, recommendations and any necessary implementing legislation; and be it further

28 Sec. 3. Staff. Resolved: That the State Planning Office shall provide staff support for the council for the purposes provided 30 in this resolve.

32 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.'

SUMMARY

4 Although considerable work has been done assessing the impact on states of federal funding reductions and program 6 shifts, less attention has been given to the effect on municipalities. Municipalities and other local and regional 8 government agencies and programs will ultimately feel the result of changes at the federal level. This resolve establishes a 10 mechanism to study the nature of the changes being imposed from higher levels of government and the opportunities and obligations 12 accompanying those changes so that local governments will be best positioned to respond. The existing Governor's Municipal 14 Advisory Council is directed to examine the issue and to report to the Legislature next year. This amendment also adds a fiscal 16 note to the resolve.
