Resolve, to Establish a Devolution Review Board.

Sec. 1. Task Force established. Resolved: That the Task Force to Study Fiscal Devolution, referred to in this resolve as the "task force," is established; and be it further

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Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the task force consists of 11 members appointed as follows: 3 mayors or city managers appointed by the Governor, the Commissioner of Human Services, the Commissioner of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services, the Commissioner of Transportation, the State Economist, 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and 2 members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate; and be it further

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Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Legislative Council Director o£ the upon making appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the task force no later than September 1, 1997. The task force shall select a chair from among its legislative members; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall study the impact of federal downsizing on state programs and reevaluate spending priorities in the context of state-based revenue-raising capabilities. In examining the impact of federal downsizing the task force shall consider the following:

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1. The ability to increase the efficiency with which programs are managed to lessen the impact of reduced federal funds:

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2. The feasibility of shifting funds from other parts of the state budget to maintain service levels in the areas most affected by a reduction in federal funds;

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3. The impact of shifting responsibilities to lower levels of government; and

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 Raising new state revenue to substitute for the withdrawal of federal funds; and be it further

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Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the task force members who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance at meetings of the task force. All members of the task force are entitled to reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses upon application to the Legislative Council. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer the task force's budget; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit a report with any accompanying legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature by December 15, 1997.

## SUMMARY

This resolve establishes a task force for the purpose of examining the impact of federal downsizing on state programs including the following: the ability to increase the efficiency with which programs are managed to make reduced funds go further; shifting funds from other parts of the state budget to maintain service levels; shifting responsibilities to lower levels of government; and raising new state revenue to substitute for the withdrawal of federal funds. The task force must report its findings and any necessary legislation by December 15, 1997.
