Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this legislation permits the school units affiliated with the applied technology center located in Sanford to contribute financial support toward improvements at the center without penalizing their share of the state subsidy for education; and

Whereas, this legislation affects the operational budgets of the affiliated school units, the applied technology center and State Government; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Applied technology center located in Sanford. Resolved: That, notwithstanding the school funding formula provisions pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, chapters 606 and 606-A, each school unit affiliated with the applied technology center located in Sanford may contribute money for improvements to the center's equipment and facility without penalizing that individual school unit's state subsidy for education. The applied technology center located in Sanford may receive money from its affiliated schools for improvements to the center's equipment and facility without penalizing its state subsidy for education.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.
