An Act to Require Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Maine to Report Annually to the Legislature Regarding the Fulfillment of Its Charitable Mission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 24 MRSA §2311-A is enacted to read:

<u>§2311-A. Annual report to Legislature</u>

A corporation subject to this chapter shall report to the Legislature annually by January 15th on the measures it is taking to fulfill its charitable and benevolent purposes under section 2311 that justify the corporation's various exemptions from property, sales, income and excise taxation.

Sec. 2. Annual reports of nonprofit hospital service organizations due in 1998 and 1999. The annual reports of nonprofit hospital service organizations required pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24, section 2311-A that are due in 1998 and 1999 must address the following issues:

Availability of means-tested adjustments. The
availability of means-tested adjustments to premiums, deductibles and copayments to accommodate the health care needs of low-income
residents of this State;

24 2. Availability of below-market rate adjustments. The availability of below-market rate adjustments to make extension
26 of coverage for children more affordable to families and group subscribers in this State;

3. Efforts to attain tax-free status. Efforts by the
30 corporation to attain tax-free status under the United States
Internal Revenue Code in order to preserve more of its revenue
32 for use in fulfilling its statewide charitable purposes;

34 4. Creation of federally tax-free entity. The feasibility of creating a federally tax-free entity to extend affordable
36 health care coverage to more citizens of this State.

5. Shared risk of deficiencies in low-cost health insurance. Arrangements with providers in which the risk of deficiencies in low-cost health insurance for the poor is shared with member health care providers in order to extend health care
coverage to low-income citizens of this State and thus reduce the incidence of uninsured and uncompensated care.

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SUMMARY

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This bill requires that nonprofit hospital service organizations, such as Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Maine,

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annually report to the Legislature regarding the fulfillment of the corporation's purposes as a charitable and benevolent institution.

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
