2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1831 is enacted to read:
1	§1831. Back-up generators
	As a precondition to licensure under this chapter, a
	facility that maintains life-support equipment or a life-support
	system must maintain a back-up power generator sufficient to
	ensure the safe and uninterrupted operation of the life-support
	equipment or system if there were a general power outage in the
	area in which the facility is located. The department shall
	adopt routine technical rules, pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375,
	subchapter II-A, to ensure compliance with this section.
	SUMMARY
	This bill requires a hospital or other medical care
	institution that maintains a life-support system or life-support
	equipment to maintain a back-up power generator to ensure the uninterrupted operation of the system or equipment.
