SUMMARY

This bill provides that the Department of Administrative and 22 Financial Services, through the Bureau of General Services, Division of Safety and Environmental Services, shall provide asbestos, lead and indoor air quality assessment and mitigation 24 services for public schools and state facilities. The bill provides funding for the division and allows the division to 26 charge a fee for its services. The bill establishes the Special Revenue Fund in the Division of Safety and Environmental 28 Services, into which fees collected by the division and money 30 received by the State in connection with claims relating to asbestos must be deposited. Revenue in the fund must be used to provide necessary training and licensing of division employees, 32 to purchase necessary equipment and to sample and test asbestos, lead and other indoor air contaminants. 34

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
