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the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife by \$21,441 and \$20,167 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively.

Additional General Fund appropriations equal to these increases

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of General Fund revenue are included to the Savings Fund Program within the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to meet the constitutional requirement that appropriations to the department are at least equal to the undedicated revenues collected by the department.

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This bill will also reduce dedicated revenue to the Snowmobile Trail Fund within the Department of Conservation by \$205,148 and \$213,025 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively. Allocations from the Snowmobile Trail Fund are adjusted in these fiscal years to reflect these reductions in dedicated revenue.

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The additional dedicated revenue generated for distribution to an incorporated statewide snowmobile association will total \$360,821 and \$366,232 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively. Allocations for the total estimated amounts are included to authorize the distribution of these funds.

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bill also increases amounts distributed municipalities by \$162,210 and \$164,632 in fiscal years 1997-98 1998-99, respectively. To properly account for distribution, allocations totaling \$567,539 \$569,961 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively, are included to authorize these distributions of this dedicated These amounts include not only the increase in the amounts to be distributed but also the previously authorized distributions.'

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SUMMARY

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This is the minority report of the Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife.

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The bill proposed to establish a \$35 annual snowmobile registration fee for residents and nonresidents. This amendment proposes to reduce that amount to \$30 per year.

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The amendment also strikes the provision in the bill that proposed to provide a discount on snowmobile registration fees to members of snowmobile clubs and the provisions that proposed to extend registration reciprocity to New Brunswick, Quebec and New Hampshire.

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The amendment also makes technical corrections to the bill to avoid conflicts with legislation enacted earlier in this session.

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The amendment also adds an appropriation and an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
