SUMMARY

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This bill amends the Sensible Transportation Policy Act so that transportation planning, capital investment and project decisions require, for all significant highway construction or reconstruction projects, an evaluation of highway, bridge, air, water and rail transportation alternatives only, rather than an kinds evaluation οf all οf reasonable transportation alternatives. The bill also repeals the provision that requires transportation planning decisions, capital investment decisions and project decisions to reduce the State's reliance on foreign promote reliance on energy-efficient forms transportation and repeals a provision relating to public hearings.
