An Act to Optimize the Utility of the 5 Maine Veterans' Homes.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3174, sub-§4 is enacted to read: 4 4. Veterans. This section does not apply to veterans and б other residents who reside in the Maine Veterans' Homes. 8 Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §601, as repealed and replaced by PL 1993, c. 680, Pt. A, §34, is amended to read: 10 §601. Homes established; purpose 12 There must be public homes for veterans in Maine known as "Maine Veterans' Homes." In addition to the existing 120-bed 14 home located in Augusta, a 120-bed home located in southern-Maine 16 Scarborough, a home not to exceed 60 40 beds located in Areesteek Geunty Caribou, a home located in Bangor not to exceed 120 beds_ 18 of which 40 beds are dedicated to senile dementia patients, and a home located in South Paris not to exceed 90 beds, of which 30 20 beds are dedicated to senile dementia patients, may be constructed if federal Veterans' Administration funds are 22 available to meet part of the costs of each facility for construction or operation. In addition, a home located in Machias not to exceed 60 beds may be constructed if federal 24 Veterans' Administration funds or funds from any other state, 26 federal or private source are available to meet part of the costs of the facility for construction or operation, except that the Machias home may not begin operation prior to July 1, 1995 and 28 the construction and funding of the Machias home may not in any 30 way jeopardize the construction, funding or financial viability of any other home. The Board of Trustees of the Maine Veterans' 32 Homes shall plan and develop these-additional-homes-and may-use the Machias home using any funds available for these-purposes 34 that purpose, except for the Augusta facility's funded The primary purpose of the homes is to depreciation account. provide support and care for honorably discharged veterans who 36 served on active duty in the United States Armed Forces during wartime, - including- the -Korean-Conflict, - the -Vietnam - War- and - the 38 Persian-Gulf-War for no less than 180 days. 40 Sec. 3. 37-B MRSA §607, as amended by PL 1995, c. 211, §1, is further amended to read: 42

44 §607. Admission

Veterans desiring admission to the home must apply on forms prescribed by the administrator. Admission-may-be-granted-by-the administrator-only--to--eligible The administrator shall grant admission only to veterans who were residents of Maine at the time of their entry into the United States Armed Forces or who are residents of Maine at the time of application, and to the spouses, widows or widowers of eligible veterans, provided that

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suitable facilities are available. Parents of armed services members who are killed in action or die as a consequence of 2 wounds received in battle are also eligible, as so called "gold 4 star" parents, for admission. Admission must be granted when provisions of the rules are-met--when-there-is-a-vacancy-and-in 6 order--of--application,--unless--otherwise--provided--in-the--rules governing private payment, Medicare and Medicaid eligibility to 8 entitled persons are met. For-the-purposes-of-this-section, "eligible-veteran"-includes-a-person-who-served on-active-duty-in 10 the-United-States-Armed-Forces-at-any-time-during-the-period-from December -- 22--- 1961 -- to -- August -- 5--- 1964 - Medical eligibility for reimbursement under the Medicaid program for residents of the 12 Maine Veterans' Homes must be determined using the Medicaid eligibility criteria in effect before to July 1, 1994. 14

Sec. 5. 37-B, §610, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 460, §3, is amended to read:

22 §610. Support and maintenance fund

24 All funds received by the Treasurer-of-State-shall Maine Veterans' Home, including federal Veterans' Administration 26 stipend funds, must be held by-him in a permanent fund to be used as required by the administrator for the support and maintenance 28 of the home homes. A percentage of these funds approved by the board of trustees shall must be placed in reserve for capital 30 improvement expenditures. The board of trustees shall operate the home homes, when constructed, as a- self-liquidating project projects until all the bonds issued as provided by this chapter 32 are retired. Any funds received in excess of that necessary for 34 the support and maintenance of the home homes, the capital reserve fund and funds necessary for retirement of any 36 outstanding bonds or indebtedness as those payments become due shall-lapse at the end of each fiscal year must be transferred to the Treasurer of State where they are to be applied as credits to 38 the General Fund. The Department of Human Services shall may not 40 modify its principles of reimbursement for long-term care specifically facilities to exclude reimbursement for the 42 depreciation of the assets created with federal or state grants.

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Sec. 6. 37-B MRSA §610-A is enacted to read:

46 §610-A. Stipend funds

 48 <u>The Maine Veterans' Homes retain as direct income revenue</u> any stipend funds they may receive from the federal Veterans'
50 Administration for the homes' entire eligible resident population.

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The Department of Human Services may neither receive the proceeds nor require the application of stipend funds in the Medicare or Medicaid rate justification submissions by the Maine Veterans' Homes.

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SUMMARY

This bill allows the Maine Veterans' Homes, not the Department of Human Services, to receive and retain the stipend 10 provided by the federal Veterans' Administration and awarded to 12 each Maine veteran who served on active duty in the armed forces during stipulated wartime periods. This bill extends the opportunity for admission to Maine Veterans' Homes to all Maine 14 veterans who have recorded at least 180 days of active service and are awarded honorable discharges and to the "gold star" 16 parents of armed service members who died in combat or as a consequence of wounds received on active duty in the armed forces. 18

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
