An Act to Establish the Interstate Economic Development Commission for the Northern New England States.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA c. 557 is enacted to read:
4	CHAPTER 557
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8	INTERSTATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION FOR THE NORTHERN NEW ENGLAND STATES
10	§21301. Commission
12	1. Establishment. The Interstate Economic Development Commission for the Northern New England States, referred to in
14	this chapter as the "commission," is created to examine and promote economic development throughout the member states set
16	forth in subsection 2.
18	2. Member states. The member states are Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont to the extent that these states have
20	enacted legislation substantially the same as this chapter.
22	3. Members. The commission consists of the following 15 members:
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26	A. The governor of each member state, or the governor's designee;
28	<u>B. The commissioner of the state department of each member</u> state with jurisdiction over economic development, or the
30	commissioner's designee;
32	C. Three public members, one appointed by each governor of each member state; and
34	D. Six legislative members, appointed by the presiding
36	officer of each House of the Legislature of each member state.
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40	4. Terms. Members of the commission who are governors, commissioners or legislative members serve during the term of office for which they were elected or appointed. Public members
42	serve 4-year terms. A vacancy must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
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16	5. Chair. The position of chair rotates among the
46	governors of the member states, or their designees, on an annual basis. Before or at the first meeting of the commission, the
48	governors shall establish the order of rotation.
50	6. Compensation. Members are not entitled to compensation.

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7. Meetings. The commission shall meet at least 6 times each year.

<u>§21302. Duties of the commission</u>

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1. Economic development. The commission shall gather and 8 review information regarding economic development and methods of enhancing economic development in member states. The information may be gathered from any source, including the governors' offices 10 and the departments with jurisdiction over economic development of each member state. 12

Tourism. The commission shall gather and review 14 2. information regarding the promotion of tourism and methods of expanding access to travel opportunities among the member states. 16

3. Legislation. The commission may develop and recommend 18 legislation for introduction in each member state that promotes 20 economic development and to rism.

Sec. 2. Effective date. This Act takes effect when the Attorney 22 General notifies the Office of the Revisor of Statutes that New Hampshire and Vermont have enacted concurrent legislation establishing the Interstate Economic Development Commission for Initial members of the the Northern New England States. commission must be appointed within 30 days after this Act takes effect. The governors of the member states shall set the date for the first meeting of the commission.

SUMMARY

34 This bill establishes the framework for creation of a commission of members from Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont to 36 investigate the opportunities to enhance economic development and tourism among these states. The commission comes into being when 38 similar legislation is enacted in New Hampshire and Vermont.
