COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "*A*" to S.P. 541, L.D. 1660, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Motor Vehicle Laws Concerning Inspection Stations"

Amend the bill in section 17 by striking out all of that part designated "~~§1767.~~" (page 6, lines 35 to 44 in L.D.)

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 19 the following:

Sec. 20. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

The fee increases and new fees established in this bill will
increase Highway Fund revenue by \$861,211 and \$1,148,281 in
fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively.

This bill also includes additional Highway Fund allocations
of \$106,954 and \$92,118 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99,
respectively, for a State Police Sergeant position, the
production of failure stickers and general operating expenses to
assist in enforcing and administering the proposed motor vehicle
inspection laws.'

SUMMARY

The amendment is the minority report. It strikes from the
bill a requirement that revenues in excess of \$1,476,959 that are
generated from vehicle inspections be credited to the Maine State
Police for education and enforcement regarding vehicle
inspections. This amendment adds an allocation section and
fiscal note to the bill.
