HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 542, L.D. 1661, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Commission on Hunger and Food Security"

Amend the amendment in section 1 by striking out all of subsection 5 (page 2, lines 25 to 29 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'5. Reimbursement; mileage. The members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the commission upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses. Other members of the commission are not entitled to reimbursement for expenses.'

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment increases the future costs of the bill by \$880 annually in fiscal years 1999-2000 and 2000-01.

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem and expenses for attendance at the Blue Ribbon Commission on Hunger and Food Security meetings.
