Sec. 1. Task force to be convened; membership. Resolved: That the Department of Education shall convene a task force to examine 2 methods of targeting revenue sharing dollars to communities that 4 accept community-based services funded by the State. The Department of Corrections, the Bureau of Taxation and the 6 Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall each appoint a representative to the task force. The Department of Education shall request that the Maine 8 Municipal Association appoint a municipal representative to the 10 task force; and be it further

12 Sec. 2. Duties of the task force. Resolved: That the task force to encourage shall examine ways communities to accept 14 community-based corrections and mental health services provided funded by reimbursing through state group homes those municipalities, through the revenue sharing system, for 16 additional expenditures. The task force shall consider whether to give incentives to municipalities by such methods as providing 18 a weighting of the revenue sharing formula toward those communities; and be it further 20

Sec. 3. Funding; Staffing. Resolved: That the Department of Corrections, the Bureau of Taxation and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall jointly provide funding and staff assistance to the task force, as needed; and be it further

Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit a report to the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation no later than
January 1, 1998. The task force is authorized to submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 118th
Legislature no later than February 1, 1998.

This bill requires the Department of Education, the Bureau of Taxation, the Department of Corrections and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to meet with a representative from the Maine Municipal Association to examine ways to provide funding for municipalities that accept community-based services such as group homes.
