#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

	Sec.	1. 25	MRSA	§2154,	sub-§1,	¶¶C	and D,	as	enacted	by	PL
4	1993, c.	425, §	32, are	amended	to rea	ad:					

- C. Transmit the report for inclusion in the State Police computer files on missing children; and
- D. Submit information in the missing child report to the clearinghouse.

### Sec. 2. 25 MRSA §2154, sub-§1, ¶¶E and F are enacted to read:

- E. If the missing child was a student at a school in this State, inform an administrator of that school of the missing child report. An administrator of that school must identify the file or any other records of the missing child in the custody of the school as pertaining to the missing child. If a request for this file or these records is made, an administrator of that school must notify a law enforcement agency of this request immediately; and
- F. Inform the municipal clerk of the municipality in which the child's birth records are kept of the missing child report. The municipal clerk must identify the birth records of the missing child in the custody of the municipality as pertaining to the missing child. If a request for these records is made, the municipal clerk must notify a law enforcement agency of this request immediately.

### 32 SUMMARY

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34 This bill requires a law enforcement agency that receives a report of a missing child who was a student at a school in this 36 State to inform an administrator of that school of the missing child report. An administrator of that school must identify the 38 file or any other records of the missing child in the custody of the school as pertaining to the missing child. If a request for 40 this file or these records is made, an administrator of that school must notify a law enforcement agency of this request immediately. This bill also requires the law enforcement agency 42 to inform the municipal clerk of the municipality in which the 44 child's birth records are kept of the missing child report. municipal clerk must identify the birth records of the missing child as pertaining to the missing child.
