2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3741-M** is enacted to read:

6 **§3741-M. Nontraditional job training and placement services**

8 The department shall contract with a statewide nonprofit
10 corporation with a proven history of successfully training and
12 placing women in nontraditional trade and technical occupations
to provide nontraditional job training and placement services for
women receiving assistance under the temporary assistance to
needy families program.

18 **contract with a nonprofit corporation such as Women Unlimited to**
