Resolve, Establishing the Commission to Study the Issue of Discrimination against Veterans in Workers' Compensation Cases.

Sec. 1. Commission created; charge. Resolved: That the
Commission to Study the Issue of Discrimination against Veterans
in Workers' Compensation Cases, referred to in this resolve as
the "commission," is established to examine whether
discrimination exists on the part of insurance companies in the
processing of workers' compensation cases in which the injured
worker is a veteran; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 7 members as follows:

- 1. Three members representing veterans groups, appointed by the Governor;
- 2. Two members of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking
 and Insurance, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate
 and the Speaker of the House, one of whom must be a member of the
 political party holding the majority of seats in the Legislature
 and one of whom must be a member of the political party holding
 the 2nd largest number of seats in the Legislature;
- 22 3. The Executive Director of the Workers' Compensation Board, or the director's designee; and
- 4. The Superintendent of Insurance, or the superintendent's designee.
- 28 All appointments must be made no later than 30 following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing notify 30 authorities shall the Executive of Director Council upon making their appointments. Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall contact those 32 authorities who have not made their appointments as of required date; and be it further 34
- Sec. 3. Convening. Resolved: 36 That the Chair Legislative Council shall call the commission together for its first meeting no later than 15 days after adjournment of the 38 First Regular Session of the 118th Legislature. If the first meeting is not called within the assigned time, the Governor 40 shall call the first meeting for a date no later than 10 days after the initially required date. It is not necessary for all 42 members to be appointed in order for the commission to meet. A quorum consists of a majority of those appointed; and be it 44 further
- Sec. 4. Chair. Resolved: That the appointed Legislator who is senior in legislative experience shall act as chair of the first meeting. The commission shall select a permanent chair from among the legislative members at the conclusion of the first meeting; and be it further

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2	Sec. 5. Meetings. Resolved: That the commission may hold a public meetings, including the initial organizational meeting;
2	and be it further
4	Sec. 6. Staffing. Resolved: That the commission may request
6	staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it
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10	Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the
10	commission are entitled to reimbursement for expenses only; and
12	be it further
12	Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That, no later than December 15,
14	1997, the commission shall submit a written report together with any recommended implementing legislation to the Joint Standing
16	Committee on Banking and Insurance, with a copy to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council and the Law and Legislative
18	Reference Library. The Joint Standing Committee on Banking and Insurance is authorized to report out legislation during the
20	Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature concerning the findings and recommendations of the commission. If the
22	commission requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.
