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SUMMARY

10 This amendment strikes the substance of Committee Amendment "A" and replaces it with the following.

- For great ponds entirely within the jurisdiction of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission, or "LURC," LURC and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife are required to submit recommendations for regulating horsepower, use, operation, noise level or type of watercraft on great ponds.
 - 2. For great ponds partly within one or more municipalities and partly within the unorganized territories, LURC and the municipalities in which those waters are located may submit a request to the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to regulate horsepower, use, operation, noise level or type of watercraft. The commissioner is directed to submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters recommendations regarding such requests.
 - 3. For great ponds located in other parts of the State, the municipality or Acadia National Park, depending on where the great pond is located, may submit a request to the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to regulate horsepower, use, operation, noise level or type of watercraft. The commissioner is directed to submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over inland fisheries wildlife matters recommendations regarding such requests.
