12 SUMMARY

This resolve directs the Land and Water Resources Council to prepare a strategy to evaluate and reduce mercury contamination in Maine's environment. The council is further directed to include its evaluation and recommendations as part of its annual report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters, due January 15th each year.
