Ψ.0	Changes in the unemployment compensation laws will increase
32	revenues to the Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund administered by the Department of Labor by \$25,900,000 in fiscal year
34	1998-99. Other changes to these laws will result in savings to the fund of \$500,000 and \$5,400,000 in fiscal years 1997-98 and
36	1998-99, respectively. The combined impact of these changes will avoid anticipated borrowing in February of the year 2001 to keep
38	the fund solvent. It is estimated that with these changes, the
40	fund will remain solvent until January of the year 2002.
	The Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources,
