Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit a written report of its findings, conclusions and recommendations to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services and to the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice no later than January 15, 1998. If the task force recommends changes to existing law regarding advocacy services, the task force must include proposed implementing legislation with its report.
