An Act to Amend the Structure of the University of Maine System.

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §1-A, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §88, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

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The University of Maine System includes 2 universities, one located in Portland and one located in Orono; 6 regional colleges, one each in Presque Isle, Fort Kent, Machias, Farmington and Augusta and the Maritime Studies Academy in Castine; and 7 technical colleges, one each in Bangor, Presque Isle, Calais, York, Auburn, Fairfield and South Portland.

Sec. 2. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §§2 and 3 are amended to read:

Section 2. Regents; chair, clerk and treasurer; tenure of office of treasurer and clerk; duties of clerk; treasurer to give bond. The trustees board of regents shall annually elect one of their number to be president chair of the board. They shall appoint a clerk and treasurer, both of whom shall must be sworn, and-shall who hold their offices at the pleasure of the trustees regents. The clerk shall record all proceedings of the board, and copies of their records certified by him-shall-be the clerk are evidence in all cases in which the originals might be used. The treasurer shall be-required-to give suitable bond, and to renew the same, whenever the shall-trustees regents require.

Governor and board of regents; process against Section 3. executive council of presidents in corporate capacity, authorized; decree of court; any individual regent or council member, complaint against may be instituted; decree of court on such complaint. The governor Governor and council-shall-at-all times the board of regents have the power, by themselves, or such by a committee as they shall appoint, to examine into the affairs of the-college, each campus and the doings of the trustees, councilors and to inspect all their records and accounts, and the buildings and premises occupied by the -- eollege that campus. Whenever the governor Governor and council -- shall the board of regents have reason to believe that the trustees councilors are exercising or attempting to exercise any unlawful powers, or unlawfully omitting to perform any legal duty, they may direct atterney--general Attorney General to institute process against the trustees councilors in their corporate capacity, in the nature of a complaint in equity before the supreme-judicial eeurt, Supreme Judicial Court in the county in which the cellege may-be campus is established, and the court, after notice, shall hear and determine the same, by summary proceeding in term time, or by any judge in vacation, and may make any suitable decree, restraining the trustees councilors from performing or continuing the unlawful acts complained ofr

fer or requiring them to perform whatever is unlawfully omitted, and may enforce such decrees. In like manner a complaint may be instituted against any individual trustee, councilor and be heard in the county where he the councilor resides, alleging against him the councilor any cause deemed determined by the governor Governor and councilor the board of regents sufficient to disqualify him the councilor for the trust; and if in the judgment of the court such an allegation shall-be is sustained, a decree shall must be made removing such-trustee that councilor from office, and his that councilor's place shall must be thereby

- Sec. 4. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-A, as amended by PL 1987, c. 20, §3, is further amended to read:

Administration; Section 4-A. executive council presidents; chancellor; campus presidents; advisory committees. The beard--ef--trustees executive council of presidents shall appoint a chancellor of the university, who shall serve at its the council's pleasure and be chief administrative and education thereef of the University of Maine System. chancellor may maintain an office at Augusta Bangor and such any other offices as the beard--ef--trustees executive council of The chanceller executive council of presidents may designate. presidents shall nominate and the board of trustees requests shall appoint the persons-to-head presidents of the various campuses and--shall--give--the--persons--such--titles--as--shall--be--deemed appropriate. The head president of a campus shall may not serve concurrently as chancellor or as a member of the board of trustees regents. The beard-of-trustees executive council of presidents shall appoint such advisory committees on behalf of the various campuses and such any other advisory committees as may that appear desirable.

Sec. 5. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-B, as amended by PL 1987, c. 769, Pt. A, §\$189 and 190, is further amended to read:

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- Section 4-B. Duties of executive council of presidents, chancellor and presidents of various campuses.
- 1. Executive council of presidents; duties. The beard--ef trustees executive council of presidents, in consultation with the chancellor, shall-be-the governing-and is the planning body of the-university the University of Maine System and in addition shall-have has the responsibility for preparing and-approving the operating and capital budgets of the-university the various campuses and presenting them-in-accordance with the direction-in

Title-5,-section-1665,-and-Title-5,-ehapter-153 those budgets to the board of regents.

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- 2. Chancellor and staff members; duties. The chancellor shall exercise such powers and fulfill such responsibilities as shall-be delegated by the beard executive council of presidents. The chancellor may delegate any ef---such powers and responsibilities to such members of his the chancellor's staff as he-deems that the chancellor determines necessary.
- President of each campus; duties. The head president of each campus shall-be is the chief administrative and educational officer thereof and shall-be is responsible for the day to day operation and development of its academic program within the limits defined by the board of trustees regents, the executive council of presidents and the chancellor; and in addition, shall the president of each campus may exercise such the rights and privileges as-are generally recognized in the administering of admissions, curriculum development, extra----curricular <u>extracurricular</u> programs, long range planning within framework of the overall university plan, and supervision of faculty.
  - Sec. 6. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-D, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §§94 and 95, is further amended to read:

Section 4-D. Options for employment benefits of personnel. All personnel heretefere employed at the state--coll-eqes--shall 28 campuses have the option of continuing their membership, if such exists, in the Maine State Retirement System or of becoming 3.0 members of the retirement system in effect at in the University of Maine System at the time the election is made. 32 election shall must be made within 6 months after the effective date of this Act on forms and in such a manner as the Board of 34 Trustees of the University of Maine System may-direct in office 36 at the time of the election directs. As to each such employee who elects to continue membership in the Maine State Retirement 38 System, it shall--thereafter--be is the responsibility of the university to provide for payment from its appropriation to the 40 Treasurer of State of the amount which that would have been the state's State's contribution to the retirement system for such 42 that employee had he the employee remained in the state's State's service. Sec. 7. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §4-F, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §96, is further amended to read:

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Section 4-F. Contracts. The Board of Trustees Regents of the University of Maine System shall-have has authority to authorize contracts with the State of Maine, of any department or agency thereof, of the State or any city, town, district or other public instrumentality, on such terms and conditions as-they shall-approve the board of regents approves for the furnishing to the university of water and sewer services. The term of any such contract may not exceed 50 years.

Sec. 8. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §§4-G to 4-K are enacted to read:

Section 4-G. Board of regents. The Board of Regents of the University of Maine System consists of 16 members.

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- 1. Chancellor. The Chancellor of the University of Maine System serves as a nonvoting member ex officio.
- 2. Members appointed by Governor. Ten members are appointed by the Governor with confirmation by the Legislature, 5 from the First Congressional District and 5 from the Second Congressional District.

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4. Term; compensation. Appointed members serve 5-year terms. Five members must be initially appointed for a term of 3 years, 5 for a term of 2 years and 5 for a term of one year. A member may serve beyond the expiration date of that member's term until a successor is appointed and qualified. A vacancy on the board must be filled for the unexpired portion of the term. Members serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.

- 5. Board of regents; duties. The board of regents is the governing body of the University of Maine System and has responsibility for reviewing the operating and capital budgets of each campus and presenting them in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1665 and Title 5, chapter 153. The board of regents hires and evaluates the presidents of the 2 universities, the 6 regional colleges and the 7 technical colleges.
- Section 4-H. Executive council of presidents. The
  executive council of presidents consists of 4 members: the
  President of the University of Maine at Orono; the President of
  the University of Southern Maine at Portland; a representative
  from the council of regional colleges; and a representative from
  the council of technical colleges. The executive council of
  presidents shall employ and evaluate and may suspend the
  chancellor.

- Section 4-I. Council of regional colleges. The council of regional colleges includes the presidents of the 6 regional colleges. One member of the council is elected to a one-year term as a voting member of the executive council of presidents.
- Section 4-J. Council of technical colleges. The council of technical colleges includes the presidents of the 7 technical colleges. One member is elected to a one-year term as a voting member of the executive council of presidents.

- Section 4-K. Campus advisory council. The president of each university, each regional college and each technical college shall\* oversee the formation of a volunteer campus advisory council. The council is responsible for fundraising and advocacy. The members serve at the pleasure of the presidents and include alumni and community business leaders.
  - Sec. 9. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §7 is amended to read:

Section 7. Site for college, how to be procured. It shall be is the duty of the <u>first</u> trustees, as soon as may be, after their organization, to procure a tract of land suitable as a site for the establishment of the college. If no other provision shall—be is made therefor, there shall must be placed at the disposal of the <u>first</u> trustees for this purpose,—such that proportion as the <u>governor—and—council—may—deem Governor determines</u> suitable, of that part of the fund,—which that is authorized by the fifth section of the aet—of—eengress <u>Act of Congress</u> to be expended for the purchase of lands for sites or experimental farms.

Sec. 10. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §8-A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 548, Pt.A, §36, is further amended to read:

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Section 8-A. Designation of police powers. The trustees Board of Regents of the University of Maine System, or such administrators of the University of Maine System as the trustees board of regents and the executive council of presidents may designate for this purpose, may appoint persons to act as police officers, who, within the limits of the property owned by or under the control of the University of Maine System, possess all of the powers of police officers in criminal cases and civil violations.

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The trustees board of regents may make rules and regulations for the control, movement and parking of vehicles within the limits of the property owned by or under the control of the University of Maine System. The rules and regulations have the same force and effect as municipal ordinances, and District Courts are authorized to impose fines not to exceed \$50 for each parking violation. The trustees board of regents, by resolution, may adopt the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 3009, relating to prima facie evidence, the establishment of a waiver of court action by payment of specified fees and the establishment and policing of parking spaces for handicapped persons. Notwithstanding this paragraph, speed limits within the limits of the property owned by or under the control of the University of Maine System must be established by the Department of Transportation and the Maine State Police as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29 29-A, section 1251 2073, and the speed limits must be posted by the University of Maine System in accordance with written directions or policies of the Department of Transportation. The violation of any rules and regulations relating to the movement of vehicles is deemed to be a traffic infraction unless defined as a felony-or-misdemeanor crime under Title 29 29-A.

Sec. 11. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §9-A, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §98, is further amended to read:

Section 9-A. College of medicine authorized; standards of The Board of Trustees Regents of the scholarship; degrees. University of Maine System is hereby authorized to locate, construct, equip and operate a college of medicine and to set, establish and maintain standards of teaching and scholarship therefore; -- provided, -- nevertheless; -- that -- the for the college of medicine. The location, construction, equipment and operation shall must meet the approval of and that the standards of teaching and scholarship <u>must</u> be at least equal to standards approved by the Council on Medical Education and Hospitals of the American Medical Association and of the Association of American Medical Colleges; - and -provided-further, - that -the. The board of trustees--shall--be regents is under no duty to perform any function under this section unless and until, in its opinion, the board of regents has received or is assured of sufficient funds either by gift from any source or by appropriation by the State of Maine to successfully construct and operate such a college of medicine.

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The board of trustees  $\underline{regents}$  is authorized to confer the degree of "Doctor of Medicine" upon such students of the college of medicine, when so established, as  $\underline{who}$  complete the 4-year course of said  $\underline{that}$  college to the satisfaction of said  $\underline{the}$  board of trustees  $\underline{regents}$ .

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#### Sec. 12. P&SL 1865, c. 532, §18 is amended to read:

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Section 18. Rights of the legislature reserved. The legislature—shall—have—the—right—to Legislature may grant any further powers,—to and alter, limit or restrain any of the powers vested in the trustees board of regents and the executive council of presidents of the college University of Maine System established by this act, Act as shall—be judged necessary to promote the best interests thereof of the university system. And this act—shall—take Act takes effect upon its approval by the governor Governor.

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Sec. 13. Report; legislation; implementation. By December 15, 1998, the Chancellor of the University of Maine System shall submit legislation to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature to revise the Maine Revised Statutes to reflect the replacement of the Board of Trustees of the University of Maine System by a board of regents and by an executive council of presidents in accordance with this Act.

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The executive council of presidents shall direct the chancellor to implement all changes in this Act by July 1, 1999.

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This bill amends the University of Maine System Charter by replacing the board of trustees with a board of regents. The bill also establishes an executive council of presidents made up of 4 of the presidents of the universities and colleges in the system. The bill directs all changes to be implemented by July 1, 1999.

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
