Sec. 3. 34-B MRSA §3610 is enacted to read:

§3610. Safety net services

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The department is responsible for providing a safety net of adult mental health services for people with major mental illness who the department or its designee determines can not otherwise be served by the local service networks. The department may develop contracts to deliver safety net services if the department determines contracts to be appropriate and cost-effective. The state-operated safety net must include, but is not limited to:

- A. Backup emergency hospital beds for people requiring medical stabilization, assessment or treatment;
- B. Intermediate and long-term treatment for people who need long-term structured care;
- 28 <u>C. Forensic services;</u>
- D. Intensive case management; and
- E. Other services determined by the commissioner to be needed.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services will incur some additional costs to provide a state operated safety net of services, including back-up emergency beds and intermediate and long-term treatment. These costs can be met within the department's existing budgeted resources given the appropriation and position transfer authority

contained in Public Law 1997, chapter 24, Part VV.

The additional costs associated with assessing the local service networks' capacity can be absorbed by the Department of

Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies the application of professional standards to nonmembers of the local service networks. specifies the responsibility of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services to provide a safety net of services for adult mental health consumers. It requires the department to collect data on mental health service utilization and unmet needs.

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
