32	two quarters of fiscal year 1997-98 to continue operations of
34	State Government pending the enactment of an alternative State budget. Expenditure levels for the first two quarters of fiscal
36	year 1997-98 would be set at the same level as the value of the allotments for the first two quarters of fiscal year 1996-97.
38	These allotments were approximately \$1,075,713,657 in the General Fund and \$154,279,052 in the Highway Fund.
40	Expenditures in the first two quarters of fiscal year 1997-98, as authorized by Public Law 1997, chapter 24 and Public
