HOUSE AMENDMENT "C" to S.P. 623, L.D. 1826, Bill, "An Act to Change the Name of the Bureau of Taxation and to Allow Other Agencies of the State to Benefit from Its Services"


Amend the bill by striking out all of section 3.

Further amend the bill in section 8 in that part designated "§112." in subsection 9 in the 3rd and 4th lines (page 5, lines 20 and 21 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "if prior approval of the arrangement has been obtained from" and inserting in its place the following: 'after consultation with'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

This amendment deletes the authority of the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to enter into an arrangement with the State Tax Assessor to include fishing and hunting licenses in state individual income tax booklets. The amendment also allows the State Tax Assessor to undertake, by arrangement with another agency of the State, to provide revenue collection services for that agency after consultation with the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters.
