SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to S.P. 623, L.D. 1826, Bill, "An Act to Change the Name of the Bureau of Taxation and to Allow Other Agencies of the State to Benefit from Its Services"

Amend the bill by inserting before section 15 the following:

20

'Sec. 15. Application. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section 112, subsection 9 does not apply to revenue collection services for fishing and hunting licenses until June 1, 1998.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

SUMMARY

The bill allows the State Tax Assessor to arrange with another agency of the State to provide revenue collection services for that agency after approval of the arrangement has been obtained from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters.

This amendment delays the ability of the State Tax Assessor to implement this arrangement for fishing and hunting license fee collections until June 1, 1998.
