Resolved: That the Department of Transportation shall study the methods used to protect public ways pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 29-A, section 2395. performing this study, the department shall In specifically examine the methods used in Canada to protect ways by limiting the weight of vehicles according to the number of axles of the vehicles traveling on those protected ways and the circumstances surrounding the use of those methods by Canada, including, but not limited to, frost, weather conditions and paving. The department shall determine and make recommendations regarding the feasibility of using similar methods in the State; and be it further

Report. **Resolved:** That Commissioner 14the of Transportation shall report on the department's findings and recommendations made pursuant to section 1, including 16 any proposed implementing legislation, which must contain an 18 effective date of April 1, 1998, to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation no later than December 1, 1997.
