Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §601, as repealed and replaced by PL 1987, c. 667, §1, is amended to read:

§601. Publication of legal notices and advertising

To be qualified as a medium for the publication of legal notices, legal advertising and other matter required by law to be published in a newspaper, a newspaper, unless otherwise ordered by the court in the proceedings, must-be-published-and-printed-in whele-or-in-part-in-this-State; must be printed in the English language; must be entered as 2nd class postal matter in the United States mails at a post office in this State; and must have general circulation in the vicinity where the notice is required to be published. Any legal notice, legal advertising or other matter required by law to be published in a newspaper shall must appear in all editions of that newspaper.

SUMMARY

This bill repeals the requirement that, to be qualified as a medium for the publication of legal notices, legal advertising and other matter required by law to be published in a newspaper, a newspaper be published and printed in whole or in part in this State.
