resulting from this change. The change in service credi
provisions may also increase the normal cost component of th
employer retirement rate and may result in additional ongoin
retirement costs to the Department of Public Safety.

This amendment provides that the Maine State Retirement System retirement benefit of Maine State Police Chief David McPherson must be calculated under the requirements of the so-called "25/50 special retirement plan" that Sergeant McPherson was covered by when he began law enforcement service as a forest ranger.
