

**An Act to Revise the Salaries of Certain County Officers.**

(EMERGENCY)

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Reported by the Majority from the Committee on State and Local Government pursuant to Joint Order H.P. 993 and printed under Joint Rule 402.

2           **Mandate preamble.** This measure requires one or more local  
4 units of government to expand or modify activities so as to  
6 necessitate additional expenditures from local revenues but does  
8 not provide funding for at least 90% of those expenditures.  
Pursuant to the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 21,  
two thirds of all of the members elected to each House have  
determined it necessary to enact this measure.

10           **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not  
12 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted  
as emergencies; and

14           **Whereas,** it has become necessary to revise the salaries of  
certain county officers; and

16           **Whereas,** it is desired to have these revisions retroactive  
18 to January 1, 1996; and

20           **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
22 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
24 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
safety; now, therefore,

**Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

26           **Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2, sub-§1-B, ¶¶A and B,** as repealed and  
28 replaced by PL 1995, c. 701, §1 and affected by §2, are repealed  
and the following enacted in their place:
