18	Amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:
20	'Sec. 5. Task force established. The Task Force to Recommend Health Care Initiatives, referred to in this section as the "task
22	force," is established in accordance with the following:
24	1. Membership. The task force consists of 10 members as follows:
26	A. The Governor shall appoint 5 members, 2 of whom must
28	represent the Bureau of Taxation, one of whom must represent the Maine Children's Alliance and 2 of whom must be members
30	of the public;
32	B. The President of the Senate shall appoint 3 Legislators, 2 of whom must be members of the Joint Standing Committee on
34	Taxation and one of whom must be a member of the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs;
36	and
38	C. The Speaker of the House shall appoint 2 members of the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services.
40	2 Appointments: first mosting: shair 211 sameintments
42	2. Appointments; first meeting; chair. All appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this Act. The appointing authorities shall notify the
44	Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon making their

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appointments. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call

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	the task force together for its first meeting no later than
2	October 7, 1997. At the first meeting, the task force shall select a chair from among its legislative members.
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6	3. Duties. The task force shall study existing health care needs and make recommendations on ways to address those needs
8	using revenue derived from the increased cigarette tax established in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 36, section
10	4365-D. Specifically, the task force shall review:
12	A. The costs and implications of implementing a low-cost prescription drug card program for elderly citizens of the State; and
14	B. The costs and implications of providing health care to
16	uninsured children up to 18 years of age whose net family income does not exceed 85% of the federal poverty guidelines.

2.0	As part of its study, the task force shall develop a proposal to fund these initiatives using a portion of the revenue raised by the increased cigarette tax established in Title 36, section
22	4365-D that is not specifically allocated to support the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program.
24	4. Compensation. The members of the task force who are
26	Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and
28	other necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the task force. Other members are not entitled to compensation or
30	reimbursement of expenses.
32	5. Meetings. The task force may meet no more than 4 times.
34	6. Report. The task force shall submit its report,
36	including any necessary implementing legislation, to the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services no later than Language 1,008. The committee may report out legislation based
38	January 1, 1998. The committee may report out legislation based on the report of the task force.'

12	This amendment provides an Other Special Revenue allocation to the Legislature of \$2,600 in fiscal year 1997-98 for the per diem and expenses of legislative members and miscellaneous costs,		
14	including printing, of the Task Force to Recommend Health Care Initiatives. It also increases the allocations for smoking		
16	prevention by \$1,000,000 per year and reduces the allocations to the Tax Relief Fund for Maine Residents by \$1,002,600 in fiscal		
18	year 1997-98 and \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 1998-99, resulting in no net change to the total Other Special Revenue allocations		
20	contained in the bill.		
2,2	The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the task force can be absorbed by the Legislature		
24	utilizing existing budgeted resources.		
26	The Bureau of Taxation will incur some minor additional costs to participate as a member of the task force. These costs		
28	can be absorbed within the bureau's existing budgeted resources.

32	SUMMARI		
-	This amendment increases the amount allocated to the Bureau		
34	of Health to support the Tobacco Prevention and Control Program from \$2,500,000 in each year of the biennium to \$3,500,000. This		
36	amendment also establishes the Task Force to Recommend Health Care Initiatives, which is directed to develop a proposal to fund		
38	health care initiatives using a portion of the revenue raised by the increase in the cigarette tax.
