Resolve, Establishing a Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effects of Government Regulation and Health Insurance Costs on Small Businesses in Maine.

**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, this resolve establishes the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effects of Government Regulation and Health Insurance Costs on Small Businesses; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and the report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

14 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 16 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 18 safety; now, therefore, be it

 Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Blue Ribbon Commission to Study the Effects of Government Regulation and
 Health Insurance Costs on Small Businesses, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission
consists of 12 members appointed as follows: The Governor shall appoint 6 members, to include at least 2 members from the
Governor's cabinet, one member representing the business sector, one member representing employee unions and one state employee;
the Speaker of the House shall appoint 3 members, to include at least one Representative and one member representing the public sector; and the President of the Senate shall appoint 3 members, to include at least one Senator and one member representing the 34 private sector; and be it further

36 Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 38 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must  $\mathbf{be}$ notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days 40 after appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the 42 commission. The commission shall select a chair from among its 44 members; and be it further

46 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the effects of government regulation and health insurance costs on 48 small businesses throughout the State; and be it further

Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be
 it further

6 Sec. 6. Expenses. **Resolved:** That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 8 Title 3, section 2 and reimbursement for travel and other 10 necessary expenses for attendance at meetings of the commission. Other members are not entitled to compensation or reimbursement 12 of expenses; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That no later than January 1, 1998, 14 commission shall submit its report, together with any the 16 implementing legislation, necessary to theJoint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development and the Executive 18 Director of the Legislative Council. The Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development is authorized to 20 report out any legislation during the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature concerning the findings and recommendations 22 of the commission.

24 If the commission requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension; and be it 26 further

28 Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
