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SUMMARY

This bill reestablishes the authority for the Department of Economic and Community Development to use dedicated revenue funds from the Economic Opportunity Program for grants to local and regional nonprofit organizations to foster economic growth activities, including economic conversion, which is coordinated at the regional and state levels. This authority, previously granted under Public Law 1995, chapter 40, was repealed on July 1, 1996. Current law limits the granting of these funds to municipalities.

This bill limits the expansion to the fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99 and limits the total amount that may be granted to those organizations to \$100,000.
