- Sec. 4. 35-A MRSA §116, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1993, c. 118, §4, is further amended to read:

The Public Utilities Commission may use Use of funds. the revenues provided in accordance with this section to fund 69 65 employees and to defray the costs incurred by the commission including administrative expenses, pursuant to this Title, general regulatory expenses, consulting fees and all other reasonable costs incurred to administer this Title.

Sec. 5. Fiscal year 1997-98 assessment. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 116, the Public Utilities Commission may assess upon all regulated utilities in the 1997-98 fiscal year an additional \$635,000, which is the amount the assessment for the 1997-98 fiscal year was reduced by the Public Utilities Commission as a result of surplus carried forward from the 1995-96 fiscal year.

Sec. 6. One-time exception. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 5, the Public Utilities Commission may expend in fiscal year 1998-99, for the purposes specified in Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 4, 100% of any unexpended funds remaining at the end of the 1997-98 fiscal year. Treatment of funds not expended at the end of the 1998-99 fiscal year are governed by Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 5.

Sec. 7. Allocation of Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund. The Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund must be allocated as designated in the following schedule.

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assessment in fiscal year 1997-98 by \$635,000, which will result in a one-time increase of dedicated revenue of that same amount.

This bill also authorizes the Public Utilities Commission in fiscal year 1998-99 to spend on a one-time basis up to 100% of any unexpended balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 1997-98.

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## 10 SUMMARY

- This amendment replaces the bill. This amendment accomplishes the following:
- 1. Permits the Public Utilities Commission to assess utilities an additional \$635,000 in the 1997-98 fiscal year, which was the amount the commission reduced its assessment as a result of surplus it carried forward from the 1995-96 fiscal year;
- 2. Allocates the \$635,000 additional assessment and \$369,000, which is surplus from the 1996-97 fiscal year, or a total of \$1,004,000, to fund consulting costs associated with the commission's increased workload;
- 3. Deallocates \$250,000 from the elimination of 4 positions at the commission and salary savings from 3 vacant positions and reallocates this money to fund consulting costs associated with the commission's increased workload; and
  - 4. Adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
