Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of the Public Utilities Commission will become due and 10 payable prior to the expiration of the 90-day period; and

12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 16 safety; now, therefore,

18 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation of Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Function
 The Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund must be allocated
 as designated in the following schedule.
