Maine Criminal Code, and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters regarding all other issues by January 1, 1999. The proposed legislation must accomplish the purpose of this resolve without making additional substantive changes to the Maine Revised Statutes. Each committee may report out additional legislation related to the report.'

Further amend the resolve by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

Costs associated with staffing a task force to review the State's criminal statutes and report to specific legislative committees can be absorbed by the Department of Public Safety, the Department of the Attorney General, the Department of Corrections and the Judicial Department utilizing existing budgeted resources. The Legislature can absorb the cost of providing drafting assistance to the task force within existing budgeted resources. Members of the task force are required to serve voluntarily without any compensation.'

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that the Legislative Council will provide assistance to the task force in the form of assistance in drafting legislation.

This amendment requires the report to be made to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice matters, with regard to issues pertaining to the Maine Criminal Code, and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over judiciary matters for all other issues. It authorizes each committee to report out additional legislation related to the task force report. This will allow the committees to vote on substantive changes related to the recommendations.

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
