An Act to Allow Maine Technical College System Employees Represented by the Maine Education Association Faculty and Administrative Units to Participate in a Defined Contribution Retirement Plan.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17652, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

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- 3. Certain employees of the Maine Technical College System. Notwithstanding section 17651, membership in the retirement system is optional for employees of the Maine Technical College System who are eligible to participate in a retirement plan pursuant to Title 20-A, section 12706, subsection 20.
- Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §12706, sub-§18, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 695, §11, is amended to read:

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18. Delegation; other powers. To delegate duties and responsibilities as necessary for the efficient operation of this chapter and to do any other acts or things necessary or convenient to carry out the powers expressly granted or reasonably implied in this chapter; and

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Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA \$12706, sub-\$19, as amended by PL 1989, c. 443, §39, is further amended to read:

Advisory committees. To appoint or identify advisory 24 committees to advise the board of trustees with respect to 26 vocational and technical education and training policies programs, to procedures for modifying the programs of colleges to meet the needs of the State's economy and 28 changing job market and to the efficient operation of colleges and the Maine Technical College System Office. 30 committees may include, but need not be limited to, the Maine Council on Vocational Education, authorized under the United 32 States Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act, Section 112, Public Law 98-524, or its successor+; and 34

Sec. 4. 20-A MRSA §12706, sub-§20 is enacted to read:

20. Defined contribution retirement plan. Subject to 38 applicable bargaining agreements, to authorize persons in the faculty and administrative units to participate in a defined 40 contribution retirement plan. A person who is a member of the 42 Maine State Retirement System on July 1, 1998 and who elects to participate in the defined contribution plan of the Maine Technical College System may withdraw from membership in the 44 Maine State Retirement System. Service rendered while a 46 participant in the defined contribution retirement plan of the Maine Technical College System does not constitute membership 48 service for a Maine State Retirement System member who does not withdraw from the Maine State Retirement System.

SUMMARY

This bill authorizes the option of participation in a defined contribution retirement plan instead of the Maine State Retirement System for new employees of the Maine Technical College System in faculty and administrative bargaining units and provides an opportunity for existing employees in those units to opt to participate in a defined contribution retirement plan.
