SENATE AMENDMENT "O" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1950, "An Act 16 1397, L.D. Bill, to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government and Changes to Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary 18 to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years 20 Ending June 30, 1998 and June 30, 1999"

22 Amend the amendment in Part RR in section 1 by striking out all of paragraph B (page 158, lines 2 to 13 in amendment) and 24 inserting in its place the following:

26 For the quarters beginning October 1, 1992, and ending 'B. on the date of approval by the federal Health Care Financing Administration of a waiver to provide Medicaid prescription 28 drug benefits to qualified persons 62 years of age or older 30 as provided in section 3174-G, subsection 1-A, the rebate percentage is equal to the percentage recommended by the 32 Care Financing Administration of federal Health the manufacturer's wholesale price for the total number of 34 dosage units of each form and strength of a prescription drug that the department reports as reimbursed to providers 36 of prescription drugs, provided payments are not due until 30 days following the manufacturer's receipt of utilization data supplied by the department, including the number of 38 dosage units reimbursed to providers of preseriptions prescription drugs during the period for which payments is 40 are due.'

Further amend the amendment in Part RR in section 2 by 44 striking out all of paragraph C (page 158, lines 17 to 31 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'C. For the quarter beginning 30 days following approval by
 the federal Health Care Financing Administration of a waiver
 to provide Medicaid prescription drug benefits to qualified

persons 62 years of age or older pursuant to section 3174-G, subsection 1-A, and each quarter thereafter, rebate payments under this section must be calculated in the same manner as rebates are calculated pursuant to section 3174-R.'

Further amend the amendment in Part RR in section 5 in that part designated "<u>\$3174-R.</u>" by striking out all of the paragraph
(page 159, lines 26 to 50 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

'Upon approval by the federal Health Care Financing 12 Administration of a waiver to provide Medicaid prescription drug benefits to qualified persons 62 years of age or older as 14 provided in section 3174-G, subsection 1-A, the department shall enter into a drug rebate agreement with each manufacturer of prescription drugs under the Medicaid program in accordance with 16 Section 1927 of the federal Social Security Act, as long as the agreements are consistent with state and federal law, are 18 approved by the federal Health Care Financing Administration and 20 result in a net increase in rebate revenue available to the Maine Medicaid Program. Individual rebate agreements may vary. The 22 department shall seek to achieve an aggregate rebate amount from all agreements that is at least 6 percentage points higher than 24 the percentage of the total Medicaid drug expenditures that the rebates would otherwise be under Section 1927 of the federal 26 Social Security Act. Any increase in revenue from the Medicaid drug rebate program over accepted estimates as of the date of 28 approval by the federal Health Care Financing Administration of a waiver provided in section 3174-G, subsection 1-A that results in 30 a higher percentage of the total Medicaid drug rebates must be reserved to provide coverage pursuant to section 3174-G, 32 subsection 1-A. In the event that the department is not able to achieve the rebate amount required by this section without compromising the best interest of Medicaid recipients and the 34 Medicaid drug rebate program, the department shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 36 over health and human services matters and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over 38 appropriations and financial affairs in the next regular session of the 119th Legislature.' 40

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment may increase the General Fund cost of the bill by an undetermined amount in fiscal year 1998-99 due to a change in the elderly low-cost drug rebate program.

SUMMARY

This amendment clarifies that the calculation of the rebate and the negotiation of the rebate agreements authorized by this Act are to occur after the approval by the federal Health Care Financing Administration of a waiver to provide Medicaid prescription drug benefits to qualified persons 62 years of age or older as provided in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 3174-G, subsection 1-A.
