SUMMARY

This amendment, which is the report of the Committee of Conference, provides that the Director of the Bureau of Forestry or a forest ranger or fire warden delegated by the director may not deny a permit for residential out-of-door burning based on the consideration of the practicality of locating the incinerator at least 300 feet from an abutting property boundary and at least 150 feet from a residential dwelling.
