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SUMMARY

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	This bill makes changes in the provisions of the Maine
4	Revised Statutes, Title 12, chapter 807, Forest Fire Control and
	Title 38, chapter 24, Solid Waste Management and Recycling to:
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	1. Address citizen complaints about the numerous barrel
8	incinerators in the State and the concern for public health
	impacts from localized emissions of backyard trash burning that
10	include high levels of fine particulates, dioxin, furans and

other hazardous air pollutants;

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- 2. Provide incentives for municipalities to reduce the incidence of backyard trash burning through the implementation of recycling and municipal trash collection service; and
- 3. Establish a program of public education to be administered in conjunction with the Department of Environmental Protection and the State Planning Office. The public education program is intended to provide education and outreach activities for primary and secondary schools, along with the distribution of educational materials concurrent with the issuance of any open-burning permit.
