Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §2173 is enacted to read:

<u>§2173. Local approval of secession</u>

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The residents of a portion of a municipality may not secede 8 from that municipality unless the secession is approved by a majority of the votes cast in an election open to residents of 10 the entire municipality of which the seceding territory is a part.

SUMMARY

This bill requires that the entire municipality be allowed 16 to vote on a proposed secession of any portion of that municipality and that the secession is effective only if approved 18 by a majority of the votes cast.
