An Act to Grant the Legislature Additional Oversight of Medicaid Funds Used by the Department of Human Services for Educational Services.

(EMERGENCY)

Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 203.

Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Department of Human Services has the authority to make rules necessary for the administration of Medicaid funds; and

Whereas, the Department of Human Services is in the process of revising regulations related to the use of Medicaid funds used for educational services delivered in eligible educational settings; and

14 Whereas, it is in the interest of the State to review, revise and implement these regulations before municipalities and 16 school administrative units prepare their budgets for the 1998-99 fiscal year; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §7001, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

2-A. Medicaid. "Medicaid" means the Medicaid program under 30 the provisions of the United States Social Security Act, Title XIX, and successors to it, and related rules of the Department of 32 Human Services pursuant to Title 22, chapter 855.

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Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §7005, sub-§2 is enacted to read:

36 2. Compliance with Medicaid provisions for educational services. Any school administrative unit that receives Medicaid funds pursuant to the United States Social Security Act, Title XIX for the provision of Medicaid eligible services through the educational system to eligible students shall comply with federal and state law, regulations and rules. Medicaid eligible services 42 must be provided by qualified service providers approved by the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services.

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Sec. 3. 20-A MRSA §7727, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

48 **intervention services.** The state intermediate educational unit or any regional site that receives Medicaid funds pursuant to the

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United States Social Security Act, Title XIX for the provision of Medicaid eligible services through the early intervention system to eligible children shall comply with federal and state law, regulations and rules. Medicaid eligible early intervention services must be provided by gualified service providers approved by the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services.

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Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §3571, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

10 4. Compliance with Medicaid provisions for educational services. A school administrative unit, or the state 12 intermediate educational unit or any regional site within the Child Development Services System, established in Title 20-A, chapter 307-A, may receive funds from the Medicaid program 14pursuant to the United States Social Security Act, Title XIX for 16 the provision of Medicaid eligible services through the educational system to eligible students or through the early intervention system to eligible children. Medicaid eligible 18 services delivered through the educational system or early 20 intervention system must be provided by gualified service providers approved by the Bureau of Medical Services.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This bill establishes the authority of the Department of Human Services to determine the necessary regulations that must be adhered to before Medicaid program funds can be used for the provision of Medicaid eligible services delivered through the educational system or the early intervention system. The bill also specifies that Medicaid funds can only be provided for school-based educational services or early intervention services that are provided by qualified service providers approved by the Department of Human Services, Bureau of Medical Services.
