SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 734, L.D. 2012, Bill, "An Act to Provide Funds for the Year 2000 Project"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place the following:

**Sec. 1. Report.** The Director of the Bureau of Information Services, within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, shall submit detailed status reports at the close of each fiscal quarter to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs describing the progress made by each department or agency toward resolution of "Year 2000" information system problems.

**Sec. 2. Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

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All Other \$150,000

Provides a portion of the funds needed to accomplish the computer migration project and to assist in addressing "Year 2000" information system problems.'

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 734, L.D. 2012

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

**APPROPRIATIONS/ALLOCATIONS**


General Fund \$150,000

This bill provides a General Fund appropriation of \$150,000 in fiscal year 1997-98 to the Legislature for a portion of the costs of the computer migration project and to assist with addressing "Year 2000" information system problems.'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill. It requires the Director of the Bureau of Information Services, within the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, to provide quarterly reports to the Legislature describing the progress of state departments and agencies toward resolving "Year 2000" information system problems. The amendment also provides funding to assist the Legislature with its "Year 2000" and migration needs.
